Brewery (&County),	Beer Name,	Alcohol by Volume
1648 (East Sussex),	Old Ale,	4.1%
An old fashioned style of best, brown bitter with a malty after taste.		
1648 (East Sussex),	Signature,	4.2%
Very pale, light crisply, refreshing ale with a pleasing bitter back taste.		
Caveman (Kent),	Citra,	4.1%
Their first beer. A hoppy pale ale with a lot of citrus aroma from US Citra hops. A steady session beer for summer days.		
Colchester Brewery (Essex),	Diesel,	3.6%
A cracking session bitter, rich amber in colour. Packed with flavour and drinking noticeably above its strength. Fuggles and goldings are blended traditionally for freshness and finish.		
Colchester Brewery (Essex),	Red Diesel,	4.2%
Red best bitter, well balanced with a long rich finish		
Cronx Brewery (London),	Stanard,	3.8%
A traditional session British Bitter Well balanced traditional ale. Anything but Standard on taste.		
Cronx Brewery (London),	Kotchin,	5.2%
A blonde ale brewed with Cascade hops to give a passion fruit and peach aroma		
Dark Star (West Sussex),	Green Hop,	
A special Brew for the Green Hop festival		
Dark Star (West Sussex),	Original,	5.0%
The brewery's eponymous former Champion Beer of Britain. A dark, strong and bitter beer that defies classification. It has a complex malt flavour with a hint of burnt flavour from the mixture of Crystal and Chocolate grist.		
Dark Star (West Sussex),	Hophead,	3.8%
An extremely clean-drinking pale golden ale with a strong floral aroma and elderflower notes from the Cascade hops. This beer is full-bodied and full-flavoured yet gentle enough to make it a favourite session beer.		
Dark Star (West Sussex),	American Pale Ale,	4.7%
The yeast strain used for the brewing of this American style pale ale is specially imported from the USA, along with Cascade, Centennial and Chinook hops. The low colour Maris Otter malt provides a perfect light colour and dryness to complement the crisp taste and full aroma of the hops. SERIOUSLY FULL OF HOPS		
FILO (East Sussex),	Ginger Tom,	3.8%
Super ginger evergreen bursts of fresh aroma. Slightly hazy, amber orange body with a quick foamy white head. More spicy ginger in the flavour with a lingering bitter aftertaste. Medium body seems a little gritty. Very gingery!		
FILO (East Sussex),	Crofters,	3.8%
A fine quaffing amber ale, richly hopped with Fuggles and Goldings to give a refreshing nutty flavour with just the right amount of dryness to make you want more.		
Hastings (East Sussex),	Best,	4.1%
A tasty traditional Best Bitter, made with classic English hops. East Kent Goldings lend a pleasing fruitiness; Fuggles an earthy bitterness. A good solid ale, nicely done.		
Hastings, (East Sussex),	Pale Ale,	4.7%
A real international beer with US Cascade hops, Saaz from the Czech Republic, Tettnang & Hallertauer Hersbrucker from Germany, and English East Kent Goldings. A hoppy, citrusy, spicy ale with bite – a bit different to your usual pint!		
Hepworth (West Sussex),	Pullman,	4.2%
This is a First Class bitter with a crisp bite balanced with a silky finish. Brewed with Admiral & Golding hops, a luxurious ale to be enjoyed on its own or with fine food		
Hepworth (West Sussex),	Prospect,	4.5%
An organic pale, flavoured with Sussex grown barley and Golding and Admiral hops

KentBrewery (Kent),	Black Gold,	4.0%
Rich and dark coloured with many of the flavours and easy-drinking qualities of a Golden Ale		
Kent Brewery (Kent),	KGB,	4.1%
A full-on dose of Golding and Fuggles hops, with a rich variety of local malts to make you proud of Kent's heritage		
Kissingate (West Sussex),	Black Cherry Mild,	3.5%
Stirring emotions amongst those who enjoy a full and flavoursome dark mild. Subtle additions of real black cherries in Muscavado with light Amarillo hopping provide a truly rich and wonderful taste experience		
Kissingate (West Sussex),	Storyteller,	4.0%
Their lightest beer. Very light Chardonnay in colour, with simple lemony / piney notes. A tangy, refreshing session beer		
Larkins (Kent),	Traditional,	3.4%
Tawny-coloured and nicely hoppy ale. Good flavour for the strength		
Larkins (Kent),	Chiddingstone,	4.0%
Named after the brewery village. A mid strength hoppy and fruity ale with a long bittersweet aftertaste.		
Larkins (Kent),	Best,	4.4%
Full bodied, slightly fruity and unusually bitter for it's gravity.		
Longman (East Sussex),	Best,	4.0%
Perfectly balanced with a complex bittersweet malty taste, fragrant hops and a characteristic long deep finish. A traditional Sussex style Best Bitter.		
Longman (East Sussex),	Long Blonde,	3.8%
A light coloured golden Ale with a distinctive hoppy aroma and crisp clean bitterness on the finish. Smooth light and refreshing.		
Longman (East Sussex),	Old Man,	4.3%
This original dark beer has soft malt notes of coffee and chocolate that combine with a pleasant light hoppiness to create a rich, full tasting Old Ale of times gone by.		
Longman (East Sussex),	Sussex Pride,	4.5%
A strong, complex IPA. Bronze in colour with a fruity nose and full round flavours. The perfect balance between malt and hops.		
Old Dairy Brewery (Kent),	Red Top,	3.8%
A traditional English Ale but with a more relaxed taste. It is brewed using our unique combination of Maris Otter, Crystal and Brown Malt, with Challenger, East Kent Golding and Cascade hops. The result in a rich tan coloured beer, that is balanced on the palate, with a hint of citrus aroma. It shows all the characteristics of best English bitter.		
Old Dairy Brewery (Kent),	Fresh Top,	4.0%
A special brew for the Green Hop Festival		
Old Dairy Brewery (Kent),	Silver Top,	4.5%
A cream stout with an easy drinking taste. It is brewed using our unique combination of Maris Otter, Crystal and roasted malts, with Challenger and Bramling Cross hops. The result is a stout that has a rich smell of Autumn fruits and a smooth taste. A sweet toffee body carries lots of liquorice balanced by the bitterness of plain chocolate and a hint of coffee.		
Old Dairy Brewery (Kent),	Blue Top,	4.8%
Maintaining the heritage of the famous India Pale Ales which were originally brewed in the 18th century to satisfy demand for English beer in India. It has a satisfying bitterness smoothly balanced with caramel flavours from the crystal malt and a hint of lemon from Styrian Golding hops.

Royal Tunbridge Wells (Kent),	Royal,	4.1%
Based on the recipe for royal best bitter brewed by the original Royal Tunbridge Wells brewing company in the 1980's. This is a chestnut brown classic best bitter. The full-bodied beer is created from a mixture of pale and crystal malts, then bittered with challenger hops with goldings used for aroma.		
Royal Tunbridge Wells (Kent),	Harvest Royal,	4.1%
A variant of the Royal charged with green hops for autumnal bitter finish		
Royal Tunbridge Wells (Kent),	Golden Ticket,	5.0%
Beautiful rich gold hue flavoured and bittered with a range of American whole hops. "Just the ticket".		
Tonbridge (Kent),	Copper Knob,	3.6%
Light malty ale, with delicate balance of fruit and hop		
Tonbridge (Kent),	Rustic Ale,	4.0%
Deep bronze coloured rich ale, with light hoppiness		
Tonbridge (Kent),	Capel IPA Green Hop,	4.5%
A beer specially brewed for the Green Hop Festival		
Weltons (West Sussex),	Persian Princess,	6.0%
A dark stout brewed with Arabica coffee to give this beer a massive complex, aromatic coffee character.		
Weltons (West Sussex),	Old Harry,	5.2%
Deep red coloured, a malty but nutty flavour, brewed using Sussex Goldings hops.		
Weltons (West Sussex),	Horsham Bitter,	3.8%
Amber coloured with a huge aroma. You are thinking of another before you finish the glass.		
Westerham (Kent),	Spirit of Kent,	4.0%
This golden ale is hopped with 9 different types of Kent bred and Kent grown hops in a total of 9 separate additions. That really is the Spirit of Kent.		
Westerham (Kent),	Scotney,	4.0%
Brewed to celebrate the hop harvest, this best bitter is hopped with undried green hops from the National Trust's hop garden at Scotney Castle. A mild tasting, mid gold best bitter, it has a wonderful sappy flavour of the undried green hops.		
Westerham (Kent),	1965,	4.8%
Kent Northdown hops give a clean, refreshing full bodied flavour for which English ales are famous. Finished with Finchcocks' Kent Goldings for flavour and aroma.		
Westerham (Kent),	Audit Ale,	6.2%
A strong ale, brewed to the 1938 strength and using the same ingredients as the original best selling bottled beer of the Black Eagle Brewery. Made with pale and crystal malts on a huge charge of Kent Goldings hops.		
WJ Kings (West Sussex),	Old Smokey,	5.1%
In partnership with Besmoke of Arundel, a natural smoke specialist a fantastic seasonal ale to coincide with Bonfire season which is fast approaching. ABV dark red ale with subtle hints of smoked woody malts followed on by the sweet floral smoky notes coming over with the smoked green hops.
